

**BARTLETT SCHOOL DISTRICT WARRANT
STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the Inhabitants of the School District of Bartlett, in the County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote on District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School gymnasium in said District on Wednesday, March 11, 2015 at 6:30 in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1: To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven million, one hundred seventy-three thousand, four hundred ninety-six dollars (\$7,173,496) for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District. This article does not include appropriations voted in other warrant articles. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 5-0-0)

ARTICLE 2: To see if the School District will vote to approve the cost item included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the Bartlett School Board and the Bartlett Education Association which calls for the following increases in salaries and benefits at the current staffing levels:

<u>Year</u>	<u>Estimated Increase</u>
2015-16	\$72,027
2016-17	\$61,994

and further to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-two thousand, twenty-seven dollars (\$72,027) for the upcoming fiscal year, such sum representing the additional costs attributable to the increase in salaries and benefits required by the new agreement over those that would be paid at current staffing levels under the existing collective bargaining agreement. (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 5-0-0)

ARTICLE 3: To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) to initiate the next phase of the Technology Program as recommended by the Technology Committee. (Designated as a Special Article) (Majority vote required) (Recommended by the School Board 5-0-0)

ARTICLE 4: To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund (School Buses), previously established for this purpose, with these funds to be offset, in part, by National Forest Reserve funds. (Recommended by the School Board 5-0-0)


ARTICLE 5: To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$22,500) for the purpose of purchasing and installing security equipment (phase 3 of 6 possible phases). (Designated as a Special Article) (Recommended by the School Board 5-0-0)

ARTICLE 6. To see if the school district will vote to discontinue the Reserve Fund (Recreational Facilities Development) created in 1988. Said funds, with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, are to be transferred to the School District's general fund. (Recommended by the School Board 5-0-0)


ARTICLE 7: To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate up to twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to be placed in the Expendable Maintenance Trust Fund, previously established for this purpose in 2012, with such amount to be funded from the year end undesignated fund balance available on July 1, 2015 . (Recommended by the School Board 5-0-0)

ARTICLE 8: To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
